## The Lazarus Project

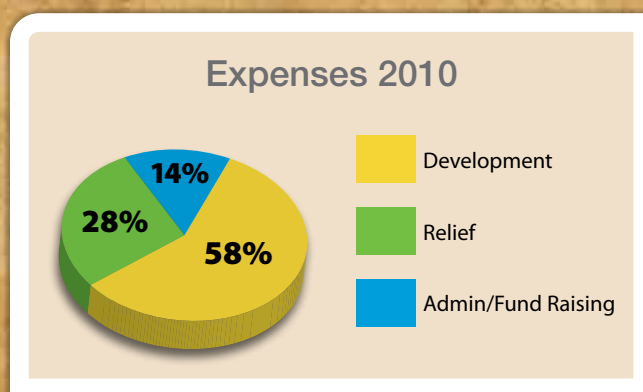
2010 marked the end of a 3-year matching grant program with the Canadian International Development Agency that helped to train 392 women and 292 boys in trade skills. 720 men, women, and children have been taught how to grow vegetable crops. These beneficiaries have gained dignity and a better life through income gained and food grown by their own hands!

## Chreso: Community HIV/AIDS Project

Since 2008, mobile medical clinics have brought services to 63,000 people living in remote regions of Zambia. Over 67,000 people been educated on basic facts of HIV, empowering them to make better decisions to protect their health, as well as to get the treatment they need to remain productive and able to care for their families. In 2010, nearly 10,000 people took an HIV test at one of these mobile clinics. This is a matching grant program supported by the Canadian International Development Agency through to 2011.

## MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS

- More than 85 tonnes of much needed food, medical, educational and agricultural items were shipped or supplied from our Missions warehouse to 9 countries.
- Provided physician travel packs for medical personnel to aid 32,400 people during the initial Haiti emergency response and Cholera outbreak.
- Supplied food kits for hundreds of families of the Pakistan Flooding.
- Assisted 27 homeless organizations across Canada.
- Your donations were more effective through the impact of CIDA matching funds of over 2 million dollars for Haiti, Pakistan and Zambia projects.



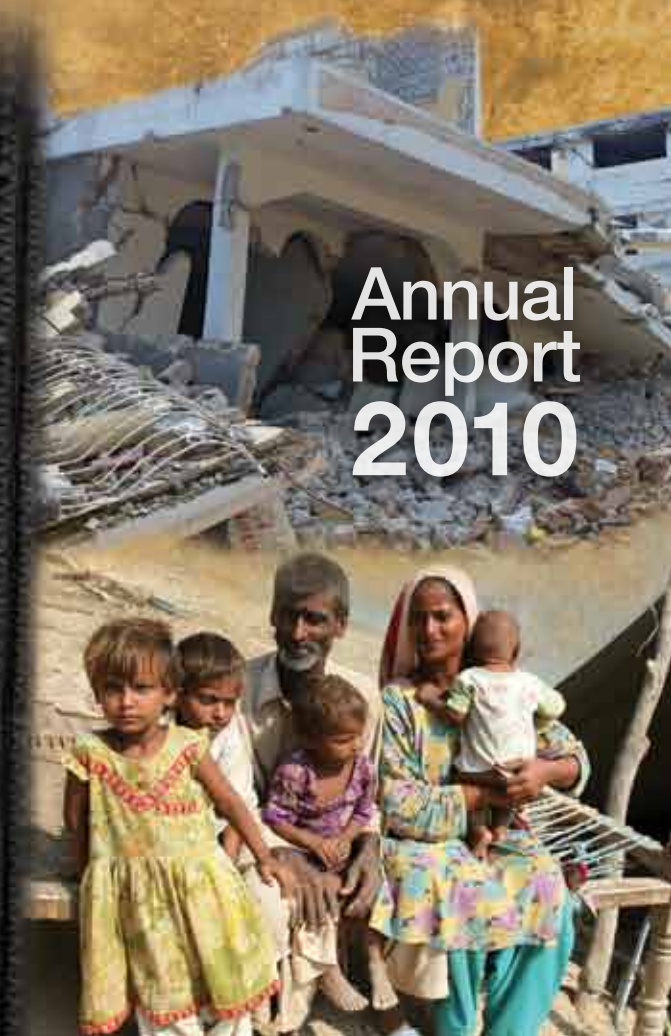
# CROSSROADS MISSIONS

# CAMBODIA

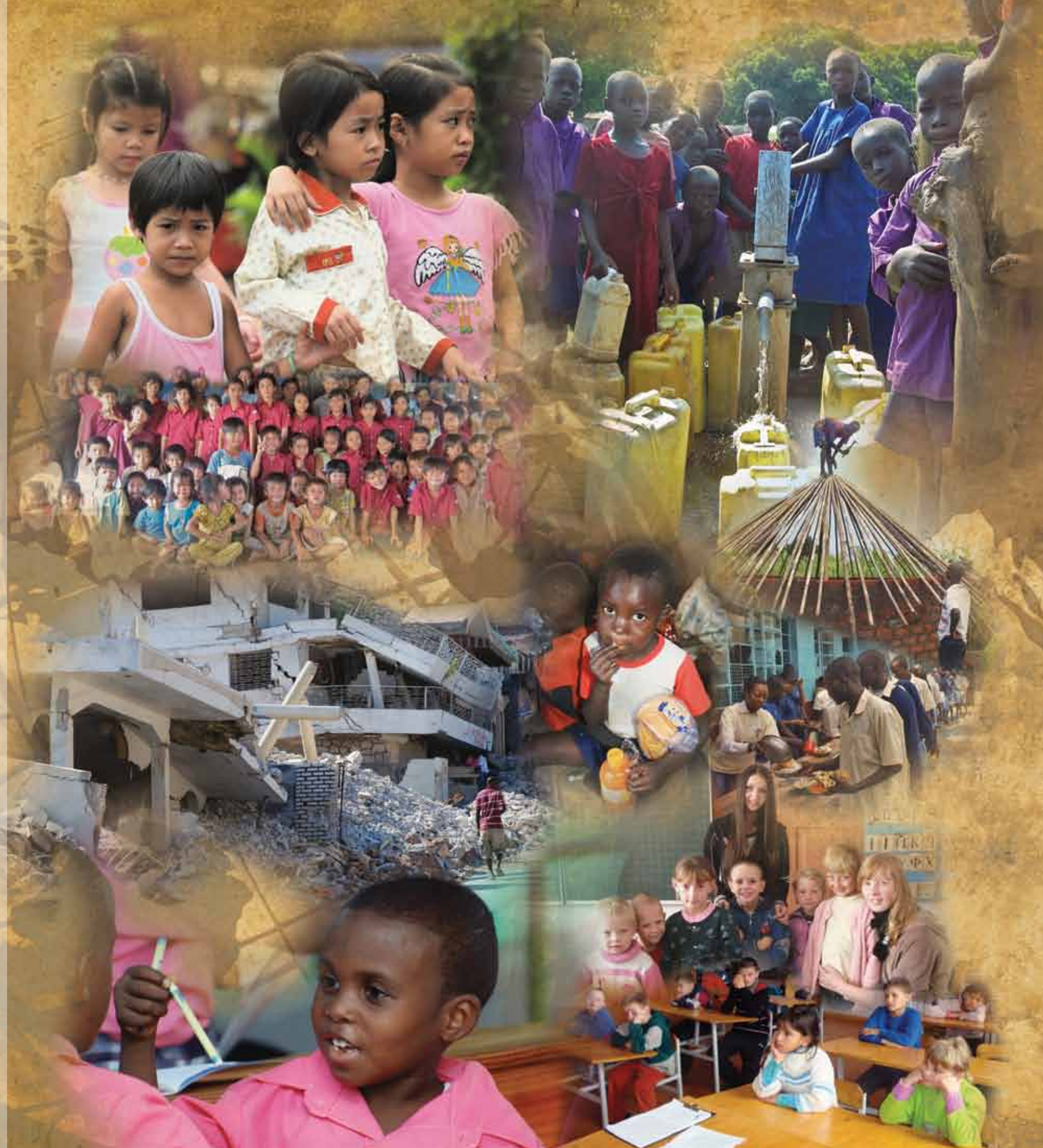
Sometimes in missions, God asks us to journey into dark places where touching someone's life, especially those of little girls who are being sexually exploited, is a challenging proposition. Nevertheless we answered the call and because of your support, young girls are being rescued from oppression and given hope for a new future. On the Ton Le Sap Lake, 170 marginalized Vietnamese aged 5 - 48 attended classes, eager to learn reading, writing and stories from the Bible. Over 60 children from the garbage dump community are receiving food, education and medical care at the Joy Childcare Center.

# HAITI

In a matter of seconds, the city of Port au Prince and its surrounding community was left in ruins with approximately 240,000 dead and a million+ displaced. Your response was immediate and overwhelming. Through your support, we provided emergency food, medical supplies and clean water in the initial relief phase. Since that time, we've repaired schools, a church and have constructed transitional homes allowing families to move out of the tent cities. A micro financing program has enabled businesses to start up again. Hope is rising amongst the rubble!



# UGANDA

Crossroads Missions continued their partnership with Victory Outreach Ministries in Lira, Northern Uganda serving 1225 families including another 400 beneficiaries to the agricultural project. People's lives and economic situation have dramatically improved because of increased food security and even surplus food, which is sold and used to send children to school. Many have come to know Jesus through these acts of love. 15 broken wells were repaired, providing fresh water once again to thousands of people in local communities, bringing great joy.

In Pader, we continued to work with Christian Counselling Fellowship, mobilizing and training local youth to build 88 huts with latrines (EVP's) and establish an agricultural project to grow food. Young women are learning life skills enabling them to care and support their children. Seeds of Love women continued to bring encouragement and practical help to the most needy.

# KENYA

The Mully Children's Family Home's commitment to rescuing children, helping the poor and expressing God's love in the community has never been stronger. Thanks to you, we helped MCF with food, clean water, the construction of more housing and a processing facility to assist them in the production and sale of French green beans to promote self-sustainability.

# UKRAINE

A love for people and care about their eternal destiny is the driving force behind the ministry teams of the L'viv Theological Seminary. Students visited state run orphanages conducting bible lessons, special performances, doing repairs and expressing Christ's love to these beautiful children.
